Chairperson's Report

Tēnā tātau katoa

It gives me great pleasure to present the annual report of the Papawai & Kaikōkirikiri Trusts Board for the year ended 30 June 2016.

The amendment of our Act was introduced into Parliament October 2015 and presented for its 1st reading in March this year. Trustees and office staff were in attendance to hear the 1st Reading and were truly excited to have it finally presented by local MP Alastair Scott. Our sincere thanks to Alastair and Marama Fox for their continued support for helping us thus far.



EDUCATION:

- This year the Education committee recommended and introduced NCEA grants for students. 32 applications were received, 24 grants were paid out and 8 declined due to incomplete or invalid applications. Total paid \$1,900.80.
- Annual Scholarship: 81 applications were received from Year 11-13 students; this number was considerably reduced from other years. In total, 74 scholarships were paid out to students totaling \$44,750.00 5 applications were declined
- Leadership and Personal Development Scholarship: Two applications were received from Jonas Tamihana and Francis Governor-Wiremu. They each received \$2,500.00 to further their development on the Spirit of Adventure and Waiohuru Military Army camp.

- We held the awards scholarship hui in January with approximately eighty whānau in attendance. The majority of students in attendance came from outside of Wairarapa.
- Satisfaction surveys were emailed out to 50 students asking for feedback on how the Trust can improve the service it currently provides. Responses were few but positive.

We need to stress to students, please start filling in your applications early so not to miss the closing date or lodge incomplete applications. This continues to be an ongoing problem for students.

PROPERTY:

It is with regret that we were informed that our lessee of Papawai farm land Robert and Christine Scott are retiring from farming due to health reasons. We are grateful for the commitment and care that they have given to the farm land over the years and the Trust wishes them well for the future.

- This year the trustees agreed to an Ecosystem Restoration Plan covering a 5-year plan for Papawai Farm. The plan will complete work to protect and enhance the remnants of a Kahikatea forest that still stands on the farm. Planting in this area will commence in the New Year.



- Ongoing planting of native trees/flaxes by students and whānau continued this year, a total of 725 plants. Students returning from previous years are excited to see how well 'their' plants are growing.

- Discussions have continued with SWDC regarding the return of land at Tilson's Road. Progress is slow but we will persevere to reach an outcome.
- The Trust continues to seek lessees for the vacant industrial land in Masterton and continues to seek new tenants. Some of the sections have casual leases on a month-to-month basis and are grazed by a local farmer.
- A bulk storage shed was erected on Ngaumutawa 4 for our tenant, Supreme Auto Refinishers, this year and completed and handed over in September.
- Annual farm visits were completed and reports indicate the lands are being well cared for by our lessees. Thank you all.

COMMUNICATION:

The development of the website has not been completed to date and we look forward to it going 'live' in the upcoming months. It is hoped that online applications for scholarships will go up on the website.
