Chairperson's Report

It gives me great pleasure to present this annual report of the Papawai & Kaikōirikiri Trusts Board for the year ended 30 June 2017.

PAPAWAI & KAIKŌIRIKIRI AMENDMENT ACT 2016

Royal Assent was granted on the 15th of November 2016 at Parliament in Wellington. What a momentous and mammoth journey this has been for all the trustees. Ka nui te mihi kei a koutou.

This process started back in 1984 and included many hui and consultations so that the original intent of the Act was not lost and ultimately our tamariki will benefit into the future. I congratulate all our trustees, those past and present, our legal executives, Members of Parliament Alastair Scott and Marama Fox who dedicated their time to this kaupapa especially over the past twelve months.

EDUCATION:

The education committee approved scholarships from seventy-four applications this year. Of these nine were boarding students and sixty-two day pupils. Two Leadership and Development Scholarships were awarded to Kiani Parkes from Solway College and Kingston Kawana from Makoura. Both of these students have chosen to participate in the Spirit of Adventure development programme. Kapai korua. A total of \$68,964.00 was distributed during the year.

The annual Scholarship Awards hui was held at Papawai on the 28th January and approximately eighty students and whānau attended.



During the year the board hosted Ngāti Kahungunu ki Wairarapa General Manager PJ Devonshire and Lynette Bradnam who came to present their Education Strategy 2014-2020. This strategy identified opportunities for both parties to work collegially together.

PROPERTY:

- During the year we welcomed new lessees, the Van den Bosch family, on to Papawai Farm. The Trust looks forward to working together into the future.
- The Ecosystem Restoration Plan, year 2, continued with over 800 trees planted in the picnic area surrounding the Kahikatea forest at Papawai Farm. Unfortunately some of these were lost due to cattle getting into the area but this has now been replanted. It is a pleasure and absolute delight to drive through the farm and see all the native plants that have been planted in previous years around the waterways thriving and doing well. We look forward to continuing with this project over the next three years.
- The cottage on Hikurangi Farm underwent some maintenance this year and has been repainted. Our sincere thanks to the Rose family for their ongoing care and support.
- Kaikōkirikiri: The Trust continues to work to address drainage issues, investigate water rights and seek potential tenants for the industrial area. Some areas remain untenanted but we continually pursue opportunities where we can. The rural land is all leased.
